Role Summary

Senior Programme Managers take responsibility for one or more programmes, projects or collaborations operated by their teams, achieving their objectives and delivering maximum client satisfaction within budget and in a timely and efficient manner. Senior Programme Managers support, and are accountable to, Programme Directors who, with their teams as a whole, enable individual leaders, companies, sectors and governments to address sustainability challenges.

The Senior Programme Manager, Banking, is responsible for leading the globally recognised [Banking Environment Initiative](#) (BEI), which comprises of a group leading global banks focused on identifying practical solutions to embed sustainability within their business operations and services to clients. The role encompasses existing work-streams such as banking service propositions to accelerate the low-carbon transition and partnering with clients to counter deforestation in supply chains, while allowing for the development of new collaborative concepts within and beyond the membership of the BEI.

The role holder will have regular exposure to Board-level representatives from across the banking industry. S/he will liaise closely with colleagues and work with content developed in other areas of the team, including [ClimateWise](#) and the [Investment Leaders Group](#), as well as programmes across CISL in research, executive education, advisory and business acceleration.

The role holder will ensure that the BEI is managed and developed in a manner that continues to strengthen CISL's relationships in the banking industry and its immediate stakeholders in the real economy, regulation and policy, and civil society. S/he is responsible for the line management of junior staff within the team and reporting on the progress, including emerging issues or concerns.

Key Responsibilities

- Designs the programme/platform strategy including aims, market analysis, means of delivery and indicators of success.

 - Identifies potential contributors, partners and participants in the programme/platform, including continuous review of progress to ensure delivery of intended outcomes.
 - Creates for approval, and manages budgets for the programme/platform, drawing variances to the attention of Programme Director.
 - Manages relationships, including contracts, briefings and ongoing liaison with programme/platform delivery partners.
 - Manages and authors (or quality assures) the production of programme/platform reports and publications.
 - Manages the project team responsible for the programme/platform. Nurtures talent, capacity and learning within the team and more widely across CISL through effective partnership with colleagues.
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Business development and fundraising

- Develops new and existing relationships in order to extend the scope of the programme/platform within their team and CISL more broadly.
- Leads relationship management directly in absence of Programme Director.
- Supports the Programme Director in their development of new programmes/platforms.
- Leads the development of a new programme/platform where it is an adaptation of an existing model.
- Innovates in programme/platform design to maintain relevance and applicability to clients and partners.
- Develops and/or maintains an understanding of relevant market sectors and subject areas to ensure the programme/platform remain current and relevant.
- Develops new knowledge through practitioner research and academic collaborations to ensure programme/platform remains distinctive and aligned with University of Cambridge strengths.
- Develops fundraising strategies and proposals to support new and existing projects within team, taking responsibility for implementing the strategy and developing selected fundraising relationships.

- Leads on the preparation of bids and proposals to secure new business and research funding.
 - Supports other team members in all of the above to ensure consistency and transfer of knowledge.
 - Supports the Programme Director in scaling existing programmes/platforms into a coherent offering.
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Marketing and corporate relations

- Assists the CISL's marketing and communications team with a strategy to build the public profile of programme/platform.
 - In consultation with Programme Director, commissions, reviews and approves marketing and communications strategies for programme/platform, ensuring successful delivery.
 - Undertakes direct responsibility for specific complex client relationships.
 - Represents CISL where appropriate, through participation in external events and meetings to raise the profile of CISL and its products and services.
 - Initiates and develops external contacts to support CISL's strategic objectives.
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Processes, procedures and systems

- Line manages one or more junior members of staff, and contributes to the annual resource plan for the team.
 - Contributes towards the development of CISL's financial management and reporting systems, as required.
 - Ensures compliance with established financial management systems within own areas of operation.
 - Accountable to Programme Director for variations in financial and management information.
 - Meets an agreed financial target established by Programme Director in accordance with team business plan.
 - Complies with national, University and CISL Health, Safety and Environmental and GDPR regulations and policies.

The University is a major partner on the Cambridge Biomedical Campus and we continue to redevelop our historic city centre sites demonstrating our determination to ensure that we can offer the best facilities and opportunities for our staff and students.

Our instinct for seeking out excellence and setting up enduring and mutually beneficial collaborations has led us to establish strategic partnerships across the globe. Whether it is the successful Cambridge-Africa Programme involving universities in Ghana, Uganda and elsewhere on the African continent; or the close association with the government of India to pursue new research in crop science; or the creation, with Germany's Max Planck Institutes, of a Cambridge-based centre for the study of ethics, human economy and social change – international partnerships are now an inextricable part of the University's make-up.

What the University can offer you

We offer a comprehensive reward package to attract, motivate and retain high performing staff at all levels and in all areas of work. The University offers a wide range of competitive benefits, from family leave entitlement, to shopping and travel discount schemes. Sabbatical leave enables academics to focus on research and scholarship, whilst still maintaining their full salary. A 10% discount rate on the purchase of train season tickets, bulk buy tickets and an interest free travel to work loan are also available for staff of the University of Cambridge.

Family-friendly policies

The University recognises the importance of supporting its staff. We have a range of family-friendly policies to aid employees' work-life balance including a generous maternity, adoption and shared parental leave entitlement of 18 weeks full pay and emergency family care support via My Family Care. In addition, our Ofsted rated 'outstanding' workplace nurseries, childcare vouchers, a childcare salary sacrifice scheme and a high quality holiday play scheme are available to help support University employees with caring responsibilities. The Newcomers and Visiting Scholars Group is an organisation within the University run by volunteers whose aim is to help newly arrived wives, husbands, partners and families of Visiting Scholars and members of the University to settle in Cambridge and give them an opportunity to meet local people.

Your wellbeing

The University's Sport Centre, Counselling Services and Occupational Health are just some of the support services available to University employees to promote their physical and mental wellbeing. There are many societies in Cambridge catering for almost every taste and interest. Whether you want to take part in a sport, participate in music or drama, pursue a hobby, or join a political group, you will almost certainly find that a society exists for this purpose.

The University also hosts the Cambridge Science Festival and Cambridge Festival of Ideas, as well as Open Cambridge weekend, which together attract over 50,000 visitors per year. The festivals are a great opportunity to get your first taste of public engagement, through volunteering, supporting hands-on activities or proposing a talk.

Pay and benefits

The University salary structure includes automatic service-related pay progression in many of its grades and an annual cost of living increase. In addition to this, employees are rewarded for outstanding contribution

through a number of regular pay progression schemes. The University offers attractive pensions schemes for employees, with an additional benefit of a salary exchange arrangement providing tax and national insurance savings. Payroll giving is also a simple, tax-efficient way for employees to make monthly donations to charity.

A new University development at North West Cambridge called Eddington offers subsidised rented accommodation to University staff.
