The University of Cambridge Institute for Sustainability Leadership (CISL) and the Worshipful Company of Chartered Surveyors are delighted to offer the opportunity for Sustainability Leadership for the Built Environment Master's applicants.

The Worshipful Company of Chartered Surveyors Scholarship is to support two students who can demonstrate their interest in, and commitment to, sustainability in the built environment.

Name of course

Master of Studies in Sustainability Leadership for the Built Environment

Scholarship amount

£5,000 per year (£10,000 in total over the 2-year course)

Eligibility criteria

To be eligible, applicants must be a graduate with at least 3 years post-qualification experience in the built environment. In addition, they must:

- be able to demonstrate their interest in, and commitment to, sustainable built environments and
- have submitted a full application for admission to the Master's programme, separate from their Scholarship application, via the standard application process and by the published deadline

The scholarship will be awarded to the successful applicants once they have applied have received an offer of admission to the SLBE Master's following the competitive selection process and fulfil any admission conditions set by the University.

Application process

Applicants are required to demonstrate their interest in, and commitment to, sustainability in the built environment. As such, the research proposal, submitted as part of the Master of Studies application, will be used as a key criterion to award the scholarship in the competitive selection process.

In addition, applicants are required to complete a <u>bursary application form</u>. Within this form, candidates will be asked to provide comment on;

- Why the candidate would like to be considered for the scholarship;
- How the candidate believes that attending the course will be of benefit to them and relevant to their career aspirations;
- How the candidate hopes to use learning from the programme to benefit the wider profession (candidate may make reference to research proposal if appropriate).

Expected commitments from recipients

The Worshipful Company may wish to ask the recipient to present their findings or share the results of their research. **Applications will be accepted until 29 April 2026.**
