



SLBE Changemaker Scholarship

One competitive scholarship is available for a Sustainability Leadership for the Built Environment Master's applicant who demonstrates personal academic and/or professional achievements in the built environment and an ambition to catalyse positive change in the industry.

Applications are welcomed from high-achieving professionals in all areas of the built environment from anywhere in the world.

Scholarship amount

The scholarship is for £10,000. The scholarship will be applied as discount to the course fees: 50% of the scholarship (£5000) against the first-year fee and 50% (£5000) of the scholarship against the second-year fee. The Scholarship recipient must be able to pay the remaining fees and meet the accommodation, food and travel costs associated with attending the residential weeks. The scholarship is not transferable.

Application deadline

The deadline for both scholarship and programme applications is 28 April 2027.

Eligibility criteria

The scholarship is available to Sustainability Leadership for the Built Environment Master's candidates who:

- meet the programme entry criteria;
- can demonstrate their personal academic and/or professional achievements in the built environment and an ambition to catalyse positive change in the industry;
- can demonstrate their interest in and commitment to the design and development of sustainable built environments, and;
- have applied for admission to the Master's via the standard application process and by the published deadline.

Application process

To be considered for this scholarship, candidates must have applied to the Master's through the standard admission process by the advertised deadline. Once the programme application has been submitted, candidates must also submit a [funding application form](#) by the deadline below. The form will ask you to answer the following questions;

- Please elaborate on your personal, academic, and professional achievements and how this course will enhance your ambitions. (200 words)
- Please demonstrate your interest in, and commitment to, the design and development of sustainable built environments (300 words)
- Discuss how you plan to use the opportunity of this programme to catalyse positive change in built environments in the future. (500 words)

Please note that when completing the form you should not resend any documentation submitted as part of your application for admission. The documents provided for the scholarship will not be considered as part of the process to determine whether an offer of admission to the programme will be made. Only scholarship applications from candidates who may potentially receive offers of admission will be processed fully. Further information and/or supporting evidence may be requested.

There will be no obligation to award a scholarship if no eligible candidates are selected.

Timeline

Programme admission decisions are made on a rolling basis. Scholarship applications will be reviewed in June once programme admissions decisions have been made. We aim to notify candidates of a decision in June.

Confirmation of the award of a scholarship is subject to the admission offer being confirmed, with all conditions met, including confirmation of adequate financial support from other sources to cover any remaining portion of the fees and other costs.

Expected commitments from recipients

Scholarship recipients will be required to:

- Provide a short testimonial about their learning experience, and/or
- Contribute a blog reflecting on their sustainability leadership journey with CISL.

Termination of scholarship

The award of this scholarship may be terminated if an individual is found to be in violation of the Statutes or Regulations of the University, or of the terms of the offer letters issued to the scholar, or is convicted of any offence against the laws of the United Kingdom, or is unable to continue their studies at the University for any reason whatsoever, including having made unsatisfactory progress as determined by the University.
