



Worshipful Company of Chartered Surveyors Scholarship

The University of Cambridge Institute for Sustainability Leadership (CISL) and the Worshipful Company of Chartered Surveyors are delighted to offer this scholarship opportunity to two Sustainability Leadership for the Built Environment Master's applicants. The scholarship is intended for candidates who can demonstrate their interest in, and commitment to, sustainability in the built environment.

Scholarship amount

The scholarship is for £10,000. The scholarship will be applied as discount to the course fees: 50% of the scholarship (£5,000) against the first-year fee and 50% (£5,000) of the scholarship against the second-year fee. Scholarship recipients must be able to pay the remaining fees and meet the accommodation, food and travel costs associated with attending the residential weeks. The scholarship is not transferable.

Application deadline

The deadline for both scholarship and programme applications is 28 April 2027.

Eligibility criteria

To be eligible, applicants must be a graduate with at least 3 years post-qualification experience in the built environment. In addition, they must:

- be able to demonstrate their interest in, and commitment to, sustainable built environments and
- have submitted a full application for admission to the Master's programme, separate from the scholarship application, via the standard application process and by the published deadline

Application process

Applicants are required to demonstrate their interest in, and commitment to, sustainability in the built environment. As such, the research proposal, submitted as part of the Master of Studies application, will be used as a key criterion to award the scholarship in the competitive selection process.

In addition, applicants are required to complete a [funding application form](#). Within this form, candidates will be asked to provide comment on;

- Why the candidate would like to be considered for the scholarship;
- How the candidate believes that attending the course will be of benefit to them and relevant to their career aspirations;
- How the candidate hopes to use learning from the programme to benefit the wider profession (candidate may make reference to research proposal if appropriate).

There will be no obligation to award a scholarship if no eligible candidates are selected.

Timeline

Programme admission decisions are made on a rolling basis. Scholarship applications will be reviewed in June once programme admissions decisions have been made. We aim to notify candidates of a decision in June.

Confirmation of the award of a scholarship is subject to the admission offer being confirmed, with all conditions met, including confirmation of adequate financial support from other sources to cover any remaining portion of the fees and other costs.

Expected commitments from recipients

The Worshipful Company may wish to ask the recipient to present their findings or share the results of their research.

Recipients must also be willing to submit a short testimonial describing their experiences on the programme and/or a blog reflecting on their sustainability leadership journey for use by Pomeroy Academy and CISL.

Termination of scholarship

The award of this scholarship may be terminated if an individual is found to be in violation of the Statutes or Regulations of the University, or of the terms of the offer letters issued to the scholar or is convicted of any offence against the laws of the United Kingdom or is unable to continue their studies at the University for any reason whatsoever, including having made unsatisfactory progress as determined by the University.
