

Worshipful Company of Chartered Surveyors Scholarship for the Master of Studies in Interdisciplinary Design for the Built Environment

Proposed scholarship amount

£5000 per year (£10000 in total over the 2-year course)

Note: the course fee for entry in 2020 is £21,450

Scholarship eligibility criteria

To be eligible, applicants must be a graduate with at least 3 years post-qualification experience in the built environment. In addition, they must:

- be working as a surveyor;
- be able to demonstrate their interest in and commitment to sustainable built environments;
- have applied for admission to the Master's via the standard application process and by the published deadline; and
- submit a full application to the IDBE Master's either before, or alongside, their scholarship application.

The scholarship will be awarded to the successful applicant once they have applied have received an offer of admission to the IDBE Master's following the competitive selection process and fulfil any admission conditions set by the University.

How it will work

Applicants are required to demonstrate their interest in, and commitment to, sustainability in the built environment. As such, the research proposal, submitted as part of the Master of Studies application, will be used a key criterion to award the bursary in the competitive selection process.

In addition, applicants are required to write a scholarship application statement of no more than 500 words which comments on:

- Why the candidate would like to be considered for the scholarship
- How the candidate believes that attending the course will be of benefit to them and relevant to their career aspirations
- How the candidate hopes to use learning from the programme to benefit the wider profession (candidate may make reference to research proposal if appropriate)

CISL will draw up a shortlist of applicants who meet the eligibility criteria and will share with The Worshipful Company, full details and application papers of those candidates. The Worshipful Company will be invited to indicate their preferred candidate.

The Worshipful Company and CISL will jointly confirm the scholarship recipient, and CISL will inform the selected candidate of the scholarship details and issue a formal scholarship offer letter.

Decisions regarding admission to the University will be the sole responsibility of the University, and no award will be made to an applicant who has not already gained admission.

The Worshipful Company may wish to ask the recipient to present their findings or share the results of their research.
